Imagine someone whose name starts with the letter "V" decided to have their signature on the tail of their square-tailed surfboard and cut the shape of "V" out of it.

It looks the most distinct from other tail shapes because it is deeply forked and tapers to two points. This shape is suitable for generating speed and providing grip in bigger waves.

Beginners may find a square tail or round tail to be more stable and easier to control, while experienced surfers may enjoy the added responsiveness and maneuverability of a swallow tail ...
