

What types of tools are used for peeling tail bark

The most common method is to use a debarking or peeling spud and drawknife combination. A debarking spud is a tool that removes the bulk of the bark by prying it off.

Most bark spuds have steel heads and wooden handles, typically hickory or ash. The head is curved, sometimes in one direction with a single cutting edge, and sometimes more dish shaped and ...
